Crime prevention officers, school resource officers or other specialists are frequently requested to conduct security surveys. Examples of Internal Risk Factors; 5. Assessing the Risk - Probability of Occurrence; 6. Assessing the Risk - Criticality of Occurrence; 7. Report Writing – Format; and 8. Best Practices.
